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1 MS. JIM: I'm Clarabelle Jim of Pahrump, Nevada Paiute. I want to say something. Yucca Mountain,
when the bomb was hit over there in the 1950s, I seen the mountain go up in the air and go in flying over
towards Utah. It come down a little ways and went back when the wind blew up. And it went back up to
Yucca Mountain towards them. I feel sorry for the armies over there who -- and like a desert rock in the
dust where the Yucca, when it passed over, it came down over them. And some of them got cancers.
2 They got cancers when I think the dust went that way. So that's all I can say. It still keeps going. They
should stop it. I would like to see my grandchildren, great grandchildren to have safe health. They
should stop it right away. Whatever they do, it's up there. It's not for the people, for us, for the tribes, for
any kind of tribes, I should say. So it's up to the people, you know. They won't even stay there. They
would stop it. They gotta work there. That's what they tell us. I've heard it.

3 And one thing, too, with Yucca Mountain, and there's all the garbage, garbage going up to Yucca
Mountain and the truck spills some kind of dirt over. They stopped the truck right there. I don't know
what they done after that. That's all I can say now.
