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CORBIN HARNEY: Good evening, everybody. It's nice to be here among you people because we are here to do what we can to educate ourself to the people. Today we're here together as I would report to you.

1 | You people, I have asked the DOE many, many times who owns the land that they're going to store this nuclear waste in. Who owns the land there? They've never showed me today or tomorrow or day before that they own the land.

Under the treaty of the Western Shoshone and United States government, peace and friendship was made at that time in 1863. It still stands today. It will continue. That's the reason why our senator from Nevada here, Senator Reid, as we call him, he is introducing a bill because maybe he is working with the DOE. Maybe he's their ally. He's introducing a bill to pay us \$126 million. But we, the people, say no to those things because this land belongs to each and every one of us. We have to use it. We have to make sure it's not destroyed because we have to be really concerned about the younger generation. They're the ones is going to be leading us some day. And today the older people today should really realize what we're doing here with the younger generation. They won't have nothing when the DOE gets through with us.

2... | Today there's so many sickness over the land throughout the country. We're already running out of things. For instance, our water is already begin to contaminate so much that we're not going to be able to drink water pretty quick. We already know that, I think each one of us. And this is the reason why I'm saying here to you people, you are the people that I really want you to support each other and I want your help, because this is a very important thing.

I have asked many, many of you people once before in 1988, some of you people came into the Nevada Test Site. We did try to shut it down. They did tell us that they weren't going to test on the land anymore. That was a total lie. We all know that. And today we, as a native people, been through this. For 600 years they have said a good thing what they're saying to you tonight and tomorrow and the next day. It's not true. I think each one of you would really understand what they're saying to you is not there.

They are saying beautiful things to you, but that's too beautiful to understand. Complicated issues like this, if you are the people going to have to unite yourself together and say no to this madness of our nuclear energy department. It's going to clean us, our life. It's already begin to happen.

So much sickness over the land today, cancer as we call it. Let's not let that continue. Let's not pass that on to our generations. Let's try to keep it clean so they have some kind of -- something to look at, something they can enjoy -- the land, the beautiful mountains, the beautiful water that we drink.

2 cont. This is something that you, the people, are going to have to really stand up for your rights because you're the ones that's supposed to be. The government relies on you. You're the one that makes the government work. Your money is going to be wasted for something that's very dangerous today.

I hope you people understand what I'm saying to you. I'm a poor speaker, and I don't have no education like some of you people have. And I see what's taking place throughout the country. Everybody around the world is talking about the same thing we're talking about right here. I hope you people would really stand up to your rights and be heard so that we can continue to save the mother earth for our younger generations.
