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1 T-A-R-A-S. This statement is in addition to my earlier  
2 statement.

3 Unlike those who believe that Yucca Mountain  
4 will be proven scientifically viable for a nuclear  
5 waste storage, I believe quite strongly there is  
6 current scientific evidence to render its use  
7 immediately obsolete. The United States should use its  
8 current classified technology to neutralize nuclear  
9 waste from research done in deep black, i.e., covert  
10 projects, also known as USAPs, unacknowledged special  
11 access projects.

12 There are scientists and governmental agents  
13 who could be excused from their secrecy oaths to bring  
14 to the public of this knowledge of zero-point energy  
15 research in open hearings before Congress. This  
16 research has been proven to provide pollution-free  
17 energy sources with by-products of new forms of  
18 propulsion. Statements have been made to Dr. Steven  
19 Greer, G-R-E-E-R, of the disclosure project and have  
20 been made in part to the public during a National Press  
21 Club meeting this year on May 9, 2001.

22 I strongly urge the Secretary of Energy and  
23 President Bush to seriously consider these individual  
24 statements as potential testimony against the approval  
25 of Yucca Mountain in open hearings before Congress.

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1 These people are ready and waiting for their

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2 opportunity.

3 I further believe that by covering up and not  
4 releasing these research studies and their working  
5 models, the current government officials are misleading  
6 the American public and its welfare at best and  
7 endangering that same welfare by circumventing their  
8 Constitutional Rights to this research they -- that is  
9 we -- have paid for through taxes. These technologies  
10 exist and can provide free energy globally. We, the  
11 public, are asked to consider all the evidence and keep  
12 an open mind during these Yucca Mountain approval  
13 hearings. Yet, I do not believe that the Department of  
14 Energy has all the evidence, considering the nature of  
15 these deeply covert projects well beyond their reach.

16 Since these technologies threaten to disrupt  
17 the current military industrial complex, which includes  
18 multinational oil companies, this research is  
19 continually repressed. This is not in the best  
20 interest of Nevada, the United States, or the global  
21 community.

22 I feel it is your moral imperative to  
23 consider the welfare of all people beyond Las Vegas,  
24 Nevadans, and the American people affected by your  
25 decision on this matter.

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1 This then also addresses the point I made  
2 earlier, namely, that big money, quote, unquote, in the  
3 form of current geopolitical organizations, will not  
4 tolerate this upset to their control of the current

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5 economic paradigm and are covertly applying pressure to  
6 have this repository site approved.

7           Ostensibly, the issue is about science and  
8 meeting scientific standard for approval. In fact, it  
9 is about global economic power and the maintenance of  
10 that power in the hands of a few extra governmental  
11 agencies and industry contractors for the U.S.  
12 military. Yucca Mountain is but another chess move in  
13 the covert USAP power game.

14           Although the Secretary of Energy, and perhaps  
15 even President Bush, may not have the, quote, unquote,  
16 need-to-know security clearance to uncover these  
17 projects, there are those who have that need to know  
18 and who are willing to provide you and the American  
19 people with this information so vital to our future.  
20 Anything less is a public disservice in your official  
21 capacity. Thank you.

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
