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1 FREDERIC GEORGE TUCKER: I'm Frederic
2 George Tucker, T-u-c-k-e-r. My first comment is
3 that I made comments at an earlier meeting in
4 Amargosa Valley and I find no record of those. I
5 consider that a violation of my right to be heard.

6 The second comment I have is really
7 repeating what I said at that earlier meeting that
8 it must be some form of stupidity to try to store a
9 highly dangerous substance which will last for
10 millions of years in an active volcanic area.

11 The third comment I have is that in view
12 of the most recent events, tragic events in New
13 York, that the possibility of terrorist activity
14 negates this. This highly dangerous radioactive
15 material should be considered more seriously. We
16 should at least have some idea of the procedures
17 which would be in effect to guard this material,
18 particularly in its transportation, which is
19 probably the most vulnerable area, and of course at
20 its final resting place, if that be here. I think
21 that's about all the comments I have. Very brief.

22 I guess the final comment I have is the

- 23 failure of the DOE to properly notice these
- 24 meetings at public places, for example the post
- 25 office, community center. That's it.

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
